

NOTICES

From the Mayor:

- ~The transfer of the village sanitary system to the new Water and Sewer District has officially been completed!
- ~THE FINAL WATER BILLS FROM THE VILLAGE were sent out July 17th. From this point on, you will receive your bills from the county.
- ~The Baltic State Bank will no longer accept water bill payments after August 30th. The county has many great payment options, including online bill pay and automatic ACH transfer, etc.
- ~Due to the trouble we have had with accurate billing over the past few years, the county will be charging all accounts flat rates until next year. The district board felt this was the best way to make the bills fair until the issues can be determined and fixed.
- ~Public brush dumping will be moving from the Sewer plant to the new village garage on Buena Vista. (NO TRASH ALLOWED! Only brush, leaves, etc.)

From the Fire Department:

~Hydrant Testing/Flushing will be conducted September through October.

From the Street Department:

- ~Paving is scheduled to begin in August.
- ~The West Lawn Cemetery will be getting repaved.

From the Shade Tree Commission:

~A three-year plan for planting trees is being created. This will include the replanting of many of the trees cut down along Main Street, and at West Lawn Cemetery. The Tree Commission is searching for a species of tree that will be better suited for the sidewalks.

~The Shade Tree Commission is also seeking new members. Young people especially are needed, as they are necessary to take the Tree Commission into the future!
