#### **ORDINANCE 2025-1988...**

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE VILLAGE OF BALTIC, OHIO, TO APPROVE AND SIGN AN OHIO ENTERPRISE ZONE AGREEMENT BETWEEN HOLMES COUNTY, OHIO, AND THE KEIM COMPANY AND KL LAND HOLDINGS LP, TO GRANT A TAX EXEMPTION OF 50% FOR 10 YEARS PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE SECTIONS 5709.68, 5709.62, OR 5709.632 FOR ELIGIBLE REAL ESTATE IMPROVEMENTS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
